Recipes

Harvard Onions

4 medium onions
cut into ½ inch slices
½ cup water
½ cup sugar
2 tbsp all-purpose flour
½ tsp salt
½ cup cider vinegar
2 tbsp butter or
margarine
½ tsp dried parsley
flakes

Place onions and water in a saucepan. Cover and cook over medium heat until tender, about 12 minutes. Meanwhile, in another saucepan, combine sugar, flour, salt and vinegar; stir until smooth. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes. Stir in butter until melted. Drain onions and add to the sauce; sprinkle with parsley. Heat through. Yield: 5 servings

I'm really not an onion eater...I usually just chop them and put them in everything. I decided I wanted to try an onion dish since we have so many and this turned out GREAT! My kids even ate this.
