## Recipes

HARVEST STEW  
From Taste of Home  
2000 Quick Cooking

1 ½ lbs boneless pork, cut into 1 inch cubes  
1 medium onion, chopped  
2 garlic cloves, minced  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
3 cups chicken broth  
¾ tsp salt  
¼ tsp dried rosemary, crushed  
¼ tsp rubbed sage  
1 bay leaf  
1 medium butternut squash, peeled and cubed (3 cups)  
2 medium apples, peeled and cubed

In a large saucepan, cook the pork, onion and garlic in the butter until meat is no longer pink; drain. Add the broth, salt, rosemary, sage and bay leaf. Cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Add squash and apples; simmer, uncovered, for 20 minutes or until squash and apples are tender. Discard bay leaf.

This is one of my favorite recipes and I always get excited when the butternut squash is ready and I can make it!! ☺
